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## CENTRAL WISCONSIN HEALTH PARTNERSHIP (CWHP)

The Central Wisconsin Health Partnership (CWHP) is a consortium covering a six-county region including Adams, Green Lake, Juneau, Marquette, Waupaca, and Waushara counties. The partnership includes county health and human services departments as well as Family Health/La Clinica, a Federally Qualified Health Center that serves the region and other interested healthcare advocates and providers in the area.

In 2011, these partners joined to collaborate on increasing access for mental health and integrating mental health into the clinical setting. As conversations continued, the partners around the table realized that all six counties had many more health issues in common, such as poverty, high rates of chronic disease, and substance abuse. These realizations led to all of the CWHP public health departments pursuing a regional Community Health Assessment (CHA) process starting late in 2015 and completed in 2016. The CWHP public health departments also completed a combined Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) for 2017 - 2022.

Central Wisconsin Health Partnership is dedicated to seeking partnerships and funding to work toward improvement of collective issues. In 2018, CWHP was awarded a multi-year grant to improve health equity in all six counties. 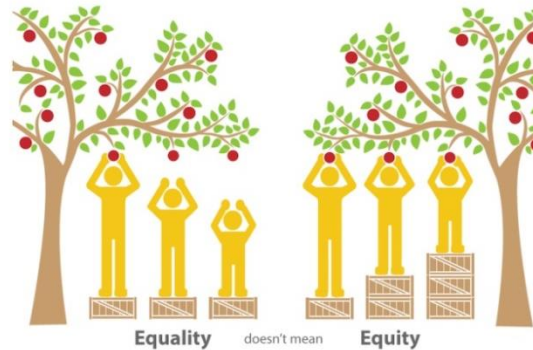

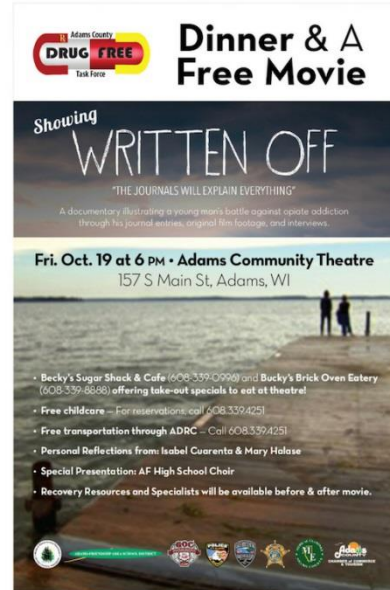

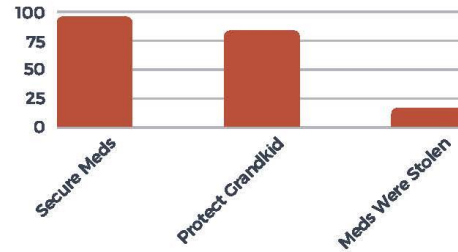
## ALCOHOL AND OTHER DRUGS PRIORITY AREA

- Grant funding received through Alliance for Wisconsin Youth to Fight Opioid Epidemic.
- Lock boxes distributed at various community events.

- Community Awareness event about opioids held at Berlin High School.

- Conducted 32 health education sessions on a variety of health topics for Behavioral Health Clients living with mental illness or substance use disorders.

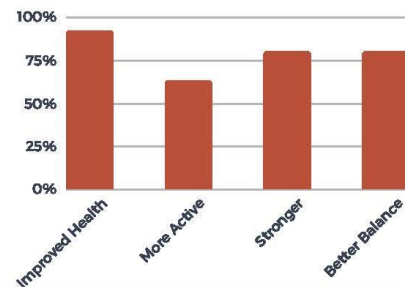
Why Residents Feel Locking Up Medication is Important



## CHRONIC DISEASE PRIORITY AREA

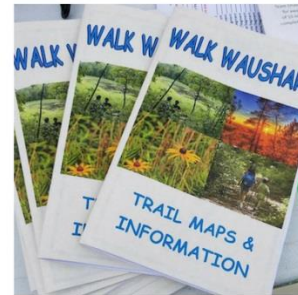
