# Waupaca County Community Garden Committee

The Community Garden Committee was established as an umbrella of Living the Waupaca Way to bring community garden groups together to streamline donated produce to community organizations.

- The committee consists of the Living the Waupaca Way Community Garden located near TheadCare and the Chain **Exploration Center Community** Garden.
- · Collaborated with the Caring for the Community Summer School program to clean up the garden.
- Teamed up with the Arts Hub Youth to have a mural painted on the garden shed.
- Donated produce to the Waupaca Area Food Pantry.
- Collaborated with the Waupaca Public Library to host story time at both the Chain Exploration Center and Living the Waupaca Way gardens throughout the summer.
- FoodWise, an Extension Waupaca County Program, provided gardenbased nutrition education to youth at the garden programs.
- Two picnic tables, sports balls, a new basketball hoop net, bird bath, and flowers were added to the garden space as an effort to create a more welcoming space for families and individuals to explore and spend time together.









## Waupaca County Hunger Network

Waupaca County Hunger Network, a sub-committee of Living the Waupaca Way was established in 2020 to bring community organizations who serve individuals and families with limited resources together to share resources and bridge gaps between services.

### **Holiday Meal Bundles**

Waupaca County Hunger Network teamed up with several community partners, sponsors and generous donors to host their 2nd special holiday food bundle drive. Nominations were collected and food was distributed to families and individuals to help make Thanksgiving a little extra special.

- 146 food bundles were assembled and distributed by Waupaca County Hunger Network volunteers.
- Each nominated recipient received: stuffing, canned vegetables and fruit, corn bread, pie filling, gravy, and aluminum pans for turkeys, squash, apples, and a head of garlic.
- Several local growers generously donated fresh produce.
- Collected canned food through a community-wide food drive.
- Turkeys were procured through Pick n' Save by generous donations and grant funds from ThedaCare.





## **Fund a Fridge**

A sub-committee of Living the Waupaca Way teamed up to implement a program to support those in need of vital kitchen appliances to adequately store fresh and frozen foods.

- Members of Compassionate Connections in Clintonville, joined us on the application review committee this year.
- The program engaged Bridging Language Barriers to help us provide program notices and application forms in Spanish.
- We received 39 applications a 160% increase from 2021 -- and awarded **3** freezers and **14** top-freezer-refrigerators to individuals living in Waupaca County.

# Achieving More Together

In Waupaca County, FoodWlse partners with Elementary schools, Head Start, WIC, Healthy Beginnings, Food Pantries, the Living the Waupaca Way Coalition, the Waupaca Farmers Market, the Public Libraries several other community partners to help make the healthy choice the easy choice in our communities.

# Community Impacts In 2022

- Taught nutrition education to 2nd and 4th grade classrooms at Lincoln, Manawa, and Clintonville Elementary Schools
- Collaborated with several community partners to promote and support the use of EBT at Farmers Markets
- Helped to collect food and assemble 101 Holiday Food Bundles for individuals and families in Waupaca County with limited resources
- Delivered monthly virtual nutrition education to parents of young children
- Facilitated the Living the Waupaca Way and Waupaca County Hunger Network meetings



# Holiday Meal Bundles!

The Waupaca County FoodWlse program collaborated with the Waupaca County Hunger Network and Foundations for Living to assemble Holiday Food Bundles to be delivered to individuals and families who may not have otherwise had a turkey and other holiday dishes at Thanksgiving.

Over the past three years, FoodWlse staff helped facilitate a Food Drive for donations to Waupaca Area Food Pantry. Foundations for Living procured funding for nearly 120 turkeys, so they came together to host a food drive, collecting food to assemble holiday meal bundles. This was truly a community effort with donations, volunteers, and strong partnerships. FoodWlse created a nomination form and sent it to all of Waupaca County Health and Human Services and other surrounding partners, serving individuals in need. 101 holiday food bundles were distributed, with the help of all of the kind individuals who took the time to nominate and distribute the bags to all who received them.

Recipients of the food bundles were grateful for the food they received and the individuals who submitted the nominations had really nice things to say about the whole process. Each bundle included a reusable grocery bag, two cans of green beans, fried onions, two cans of cream of mushroom soup, stovetop stuffing, gravy, and one coupon for a turkey from Piggly Wiggly. Additionally, FoodWlse added instructions on safely handling a turkey, recipes, and community resources. We plan to expand and continue these wonderful community collaborations to help people who are experiencing food insecurity.



# Community Collaborations!

FoodWlse established a new partnership with the Waupaca Public Library and the Waupaca Community Garden. A series of Fruit and Veggie related story times were hosted at varying locations throughout the county. June was kicked off with a Strawberry Full Moon Hike at the Waupaca Community Garden, highlighting the garden as a community space open to all. FoodWlse provided strawberry yogurt parfaits and helped families harvest rhubarb from the garden while the library read two children stories and led the hike around the neighborhood. Additional collaborations included Fit Families and Healthy Beginnings events where FoodWlse helped to arrange for a farm market vendor to set up during so families could be educated on how to redeem their benefits at the market.
